Now that I have returned from overseas, I look forward to seeing you at our monthly PTSA meetings.

This past week, FCPS School Board member Kathy Smith answered questions on the budget and the proposed changes in the grading scale and delayed start. You are encouraged to send an email with your concerns to ALL of the School Board Members at schoolboardmembers@fcps.edu.

The PTSA is having a special program on Thursday, March 26 at 7pm "**Saturday Night in the Suburbs**", which is a free program provided to increase parental awareness about what teens are doing in the community when their parents aren't looking.

On April 16th, there will also be a Substance Abuse Prevention and awareness forum at the Chantilly High Lecture Hall during our regularly scheduled PTSA meeting time. We will have a panel of parent speakers whose lives have been impacted by their children's use of alcohol and drugs, including Greg Lannes, who lost his daughter Alicia to an overdose last year. This program is a result of the efforts of the Westfield, Chantilly, and Centreville PTSA's, and their respective Community Coalitions.

An awareness program is also being held, free of charge, on March 5th, 7pm at the Virginia Run Community Center. It is sponsored by the Sully Police and Alcohol and Drug Services.

The All Night Grad Party planning activities continue. Some time this coming week, you will receive an invitation to the **Phantom Ball**, which is a quiet fundraiser for a "non-existent" dance requesting voluntary donations to the ANGP.

A free program entitled **"A Parent Wake-Up Call: Preventing Teen Substance Abuse"** will be held from 7 to 8:30 p.m. on **Thursday, April 16** in the auditorium of Chantilly High School. Parents and teens are invited to hear a variety of speakers discuss the signs and symptoms of teenage drug abuse and what action parents can take to prevent abuse or if they suspect their teens have started to use illegal drugs. Parents can obtain supportive resources and learn from the experiences of professional counselors, local parents, court representatives and youth who have been through treatment.

The Virginia State Park Youth Conservation Corps is a summer education and community service program for youth aged 14–17.. Under the guidance of adult leaders serving as mentors, role models, technical trainers and supervisors crews from 10–12 members carry out a wide variety of conservation activities at Virginia State Parks. Projects include restoration and preservation of wetlands, stream banks, and other wildlife habitat, including that of threatened and endangered species; water quality testing, removal of non-native invasive plants and weeds, landscaping, mapping, surveying, recycling and other community improvements. Participants learn about the environment through fieldwork and service projects. Crew members will receive a \$ 500 payment upon completion of the program. Applicants may select the session of their choice, but not the available parks. Parent Guide to Personal Safety for Youth

Because of the exceptional popularity of the **KidSafe Virginia parent guides**, the Governor's Office for Substance Abuse Prevention (GOSAP) recently worked to revise, update, and combine the previous parent guides into one guide. The purpose of the new publication, Prevention Comes First: Parent Guide to Personal Safety for Youth, is to educate parents about some of the potential safety threats children may face and to assist parents in communicating with their children about personal safety.

The topics covered in the guide include: fire safety, internet safety, driving safety, bullying, gangs, inhalant abuse prevention, and underage drinking. Beginning December 1, 2007, the parent guides will be available at fire and rescue stations and Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) offices throughout the Commonwealth. The program runs from October 5, 2008 through April 3, 2009. Even if you have signed up in the past, you must do this each year to allow Giant to designate funds to the school of your choice.
